Dear Parents,

We have had a great start to this half term with some really positive feedback from parents and visitors. We have just had our whole school audit report from the Trust and they were really pleased with the progress and improvements seen. The following are some really encouraging extracts:

'Attendance procedures are robust and attendance was above national last year. Communication with parents is swift and followed up quickly to ensure pupils attend and learn. There is a strong culture of attendance at the school and processes and procedures are followed. This is much improved and is showing significant improvement in children's attendance.'

Behaviour in classrooms is generally good. There are some strong strategies in place to ensure pupils are working in an expected manner. This has improved greatly since the last review and pupils are much quicker to settle when strategies are used by staff.

Overall, pupils have a positive experience of the academy. They recognise the improvements that have been made in their learning, the environment and in some pupils behaviour in recent times. Pupils feel they get recognised for the good work they do and they appreciate that the academy is a friendly place where they enjoy coming.

Pupils are confident that the academy has taught them how to look after themselves on-line as well as how to make and maintain caring friendships. This is evident in the way that they play and work together around the academy.

They were very clear about the academy values and could talk about these; they were also fully aware of the British Values and how these affected daily life. They were pleased to have a School Council, who could listen to them and talk to School Leaders about things that they were concerned about.'

We do have a few areas to further improve and most of these are about 'consistency' which is definitely growing now that we have a well performing, permanent staff team on board.

Thank you for completing the questionnaires at parent consultation evenings. These are so positive and we are very proud of what we achieve each day and of our children. One common response was that our website is not something parents use a lot – I would urge you to have a look and access plans for your child's class, from the classes page, or each subject from the curriculum pages. Please don't hesitate to contact your child's class teacher for any further information about what is being taught or any aspect of school.
