Dear Parents,

I hope you are all looking forward to a rest and recoup over the Easter Break. We have had lots of coughs and colds recently and hopefully a break will help.

We have had a very active half term, although very short! We have really enjoyed the fun activities of comic relief and world book day and am sure the children did too.

Highlights of this term have to be the super class assemblies and drop in sessions for parents. We have got some much positive feedback from you about these and it really does help that you see what your lovely children are doing at school. We also welcome the opportunity for you to get to know the staff and us you, better!

As this newsletter goes out, I am finding out more about on-line safety and the current issues that I know are apparent both here and most other schools across the country. You may have heard on the news that there have been issues with Whatsapp and Smartphones resulting in many calling for them to be banned for under 16's. I don't believe this is possible, but we do need to help our young people to use them responsibly as they grow up. To this end, I will be increasing the online safety aspects in our curriculum, and adding a further selection of workshops, speakers and videos for parents so that we are all aware. I am running two information sessions for parents, which I would urge you to attend if possible, particularly parents of pupils in Year 5 and 6. The first of these is just for Kingfishers class, and will take place at 2pm on Wednesday 17th April, and again on Thursday 18th April at 5pm (please note the change of date for the latter). I will be releasing dates soon for the rest of school and sending information leaflets home too.

Please be aware that we have asked children not to ride their scooters or bicycles on school premises, as they enter from the gate on the public footpath—this is as we have had some issues with safety. It is quite a narrow pathway and is not safe with the age range and number of children and parents using the space. Please remind your children.

We look forward to supporting Year 6 in their SATS in May and the rest of school during the summer term, so please do support them too by ensuring they are at school on time. Also during the summer term, we are delivering our relationships education lessons and will send home information for you to respond to. As part of this, we are working on relationships throughout the school and will re-visit our Anti-Bullying Charter that we put together in 2022-3. It is important that we get everyone on board with this and welcome your input too.

Finally, I hope you all enjoy the Easter celebrations when they come.



We're looking forward to a fun final term full of sporting events, and fun things such as sports day, the Gressenhall trip and of course; the residential!














#### **Sports**
